

LOOKING

Well over a half century ago I dimly recall our entire photography class being herded outside by our instructor and told to pick a spot, any spot. We were then told that we must remain in that

spot and compose and shoot 36 frames and every frame must be a different, meaningful composition. This was, of course, in the days of film and I was absolutely dumfounded that this instructor could possibly think we would be able to compose 36 shots with meaningful subject matter. I was even more stunned that in less than a half hour I did not have enough film to photograph all the potential images around me.

The exercise proved one of the basic tenets of photography. We don't really look, we scan and we react to the scan barely engaging any thought process. Looking requires engaging the creative side of our brain and once you do engage an entirely different world opens up.

On one of our recent days of single digit temperature, George Lepp roused me from my winter torpor and convinced me it would be a great day to photograph ice. We tromped around Tumalo Creek in Shevlin Park but our vision didn't match conditions. Making lemonade out of lemons may not be an appropriate metaphor on a subzero day but that's what we did. The tough part, getting there, had already been accomplished. We each picked a spot and started shooting. For nearly an hour I never moved out of a two-foot circle. The more I shot the more I saw. Tiny hairs of hoarfrost suddenly appeared, bubble formations danced under the ice and backlit particles of ice sparkled like diamonds. My class all those years ago flooded back into my conscious memory – look and you will see.

As we walked back to the car we shared our thought process. Standing not 50 yards apart we both found an array of photo opportunities

and saw our subject with entirely different perspectives. We both photographed the creek but if you looked at our images side by side you would be hard pressed to believe we were at the same location.

Michelangelo said "I saw the angel in the marble and carved until I set him free". We all see differently and it's our job to release what we see so that others can see it. But first you must look.
