



We have a traveling membership with many of us driving to California at various times for it's weather and wonderful photographic options.

Word of caution this year--check Caltrans before planning your driving route. As of 2/24 there are 9 SR 1 closures do to mudslides and flooding in northern and central CA.

Per CBS, **Pfeiffer Canyon Bridge in Big Sur is closed** due to cracks in the underside of the bridge. It could take 1-2 years to replace the bridge.

Route 50: closed between Pollock Pines and Kyburz as it's cracked and in danger of buckling.

Yosemite: For the next week or so, the only entrance is Highway 140.

HAVE YOU CALIBRATED YOUR MONITOR RECENTLY?

When your image is projected for critique/ video/slide show, you want it as close as possible to the color you intended. Your monitor will experience a color shift over time, so you need to recalibrate it every few months, if not more often.

CCC was given 1 copy of Spyder software from Datacolor for our club members to use. It resides with Jim Sellers and he'll gladly let you use it to calibrate your monitor.
