



## A PROFESSIONAL PHOTOGRAPHER RELATES HIS STORY ABOUT AIR TRAVEL WITH HIS DRONE AND BATTERY

Colin Smith is an Adobe ACP (Adobe Community Professional) with over 20 years experience in the creative industry.

"Last week I was kicked off my Southwest flight. The overheads were full and they wanted to check in my drone, which was fine, but I needed to remove the batteries and hand carry them. The batteries aren't that different to what's in a laptop, but according to FAA regulations, all spare batteries need to be carry on, in part due to the temperature of a class C cargo hold. The flight attendant didn't know their battery policy, asked the pilot, who didn't know, so ordered me ejected from the plane. Eventually they realized the batteries were permitted, 81WH, the limit per battery is 100wH, of course the plane was long gone without me.

So I made a little video about the whole thing, not an angry video, but more of an educational one. This spread all over the internet on Monday. My goal with this wasn't to get anyone in trouble, it's not a revenge video. The purpose was to help educate people about carry on batteries."

## PHOTOSHOP TIP ANOTHER QUICK WAY TO DUPLICATE YOUR IMAGE

Have you ever worked long and hard on an image developing multiple layers until it looks pretty good? But, you want to try a few more "what if I do this" to get it just right? A quick way of trying different filters/adjustments is to duplicate your image by going to the bottom of the history panel, and clicking on the icon with the plus sign. It duplicates your image exactly with all the layers too, allowing you to try different adjustments without the fear of deleting anything in your initial image file.

When you find the copy of the image you like best, delete all the duplicates and apply that change to your original file.

one of becoming bored by repetitive exercise. Some of the training involves mental exercises to improve focus, slow heart rate and achieve a higher mental state. The physical exercises improve stamina, reflexes, coordination and a whole host of other benefits like better flexibility and an ability to adapt to ever changing conditions.

Anyone who has spent time in the military has experienced this cross training and it transcends the physical. Even manufacturers have learned the value of cross training. Honda learned long ago that assigning an individual to the same mind numbing task day after day actually reduced efficiency. They developed a team concept and members of the team learned each other's job and constantly changed what they where doing from day to day. It was also not unusual to have members of the team or the whole team assigned to new tasks on a frequent basis. Thus they became far more valuable assets that could handle a multitude of tasks. A surprise side benefit was that the changes produced more efficient ways of doing things as different individuals saw the task through new eyes.

I'm shocked by the number of photographers I know who loudly profess to only be interested in one aspect of photography such as land-scapes. That sort of narrow vision seriously impacts the quality of your work.

How sad that we had one of the top portrait photographers in the world speaking in Bend and only 50 people showed! I'm sure the majority of photographers chose the very narrow thinking that there was little to learn by listening to a portrait photographer. Such thinking goes far beyond mere stupidity. All photography is inextricably linked by a web of commonality. Light, form, texture, color, story, depth, focus, the list is endless. Exploring other areas of photography can only make your skill level in your favorite discipline that much better. Furthermore, it can be just plain fun!

I have always loved editorial photography for this very reason. It's the ultimate in cross training as you never know what your next assignment might involve. However, the opportunities to cross train in Central Oregon without the deadline intensity of editorial work are boundless. There is something always happening and getting out and trying new things can only improve your skill level in your first love – photographically speaking.
