





At our Alvord Desert workshop we were deluged by rain. It rained traveling to this remote part of Oregon, it rained all weekend and it rained on the way home. The 2 primary photo sites were a complete write off. The vast cracked mud expanse of the Playa was under water and hiking to the Borax Springs in gumbo mud was impossible. The truly inspiring thing is that no one complained or whined and in fact the spirit de corps was incredibly high. This group had a good time in spite of the weather and several individuals remarked it was one of the best workshops ever! How could this be such a successful workshop?

We had plenty of time to talk and the prevailing theory is that the talk led to sharing information and in some cases people actually had time to sit quietly and study their manuals - something they rarely did. Furthermore, people had to hone their vision skills. When Plan A evaporates or more accurately is submerged it's time to break out Plan B. It was time to really look at the Alvord and see all the other marvelous photo opportunities. Those folks who had always wanted to try panoramas, or time lapse or even HDR imaging didn't feel the compelling need to capture the consummate iconic image and instead relaxed

and experimented.

Adaptability under adverse and changing conditions has always been the hallmark of great photographers. I saw this manifested in spades! These folks made the weather work for them and they took their time looking around and they found subject matter previously unexplored.

I now have the images the participants submitted for our critique night and the work is incredible! These people didn't make lemonade out of lemons, they cultivated the trees and picked the fruit!

The lessons learned were many and I know it was a real epiphany for me. I was really stressed by the weather and fearful we would not be able to provide a quality photo shoot experience. What I learned is that I should have more faith in my fellow photographers and they can easily rise above the conditions and create magic were there is none.

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JUNE 20TH PROGRAM FEATURING JOHN STEWART

John A. Stewart has a Bachelor of Arts and Master of Fine Arts degree in Motion Picture Production from UCLA. He is a Professor Emeritus from Loyola Marymount University's School of Film & Television, in Los Angeles where he taught for twenty-three years. Prior to LMU, he was Head of the Cinematography department at the Australian Film and Television School in Sydney. After college, John taught at The Art Center College of Design in Los Angles, and then at the Northwest Film & Video Center in Portland. For the past three years, John and his wife have happily made their home in Bend.

In addition to his teaching and film production, John has pursued his lifelong passion for still photography. His creative work/research has explored the human portrait through the media of film, digital-video, interview, and still photography. His work has taken him to such places as: India, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Pakistan, Egypt, Haiti, Guate-

mala, Brazil, Venezuela, Kenya, Indonesia, and Upper Volta. John has been the recipient of a grant from the American Film Institute. His films and videos have been widely screened at film festivals and museums throughout the United States and Europe.

John's talk will be about the visual nature of film and ways for still photographers to make the transition from stills to expressive digital-video/motion picture
