value of free time and how quickly that time seems to flit by. No matter what your present work status there is never enough time. We can never get away to do some photography. We are always "going to get around to it". Furthermore, the very nature of photography is that it is a huge time sucker whether it is capturing, editing or sharing our images. It's time we enjoy but nevertheless it's still a lot of time and this doesn't even take in account time spent learning about photography and related software nor planning travel and then traveling to a photo destination whether it's to a local photo opportunity or somewhere to a distant part of our planet.

I spent many years heading up training and development at American Honda and I can tell you time management is a huge problem in the corporate world. We spent a ton of money putting people through time management training.
