

#### **ICONIC INSANITY**

Gary Alvis, who shares a lot of my personal opinions on photography sent me the adjacent image taken by Ryan Prawiradjaja.

This is just plan nuts. Why on earth anyone would willing set up and shoot the same subject as a hundred other people mystifies me. Apparently, they all think they are going to come away with something different. In my opinion they are not photographers, they are collectors. These collectors have a bucket list of iconic places and their sole ambition is to visit these places, document that they have been there and move on to the next one.



I derive little satisfaction in these mass photography events and sadly the throngs of people overrunning our National Parks means I will never be able to enjoy these places in splendid solitude or for that matter any other iconic place in the world. Having shots ruined by ignorant passerbys, headlights, and city light pollution has become routine. Seeing a photographer with a tripod is apparently a beacon for everyone with an iPhone. I was photographing a bare Aspen grove a few weeks ago and a half a dozen people jumped out of their cars and came running over to see what the attraction was and, of course, photograph right next to me.

The overwhelming attraction of my trips to Patagonia was the remoteness of the location. Thanks to Joyce Norman, I got taken to places rarely photographed and even well-known areas had no more than a handful of people. When I photograph locally it's usually with one or possibly two people and that list of fellow photographers is just a handful of friends with like-minded objectives. We travel to our destination togeth-

er but very rarely are we side by side when shooting because we have different viewpoints of what makes a good shot. And one more thing... we keep our mouths shut about where we have been. The location of new discoveries do not get broadcast on Facebook, social media or published. It's unlikely our "discoveries" are the first but we feel the need to do our small part to limit the stampede of collectors. Blabbing a location is a sure-fire way of getting axed from my list of people accompanying me. That doesn't mean we have some secret bond it just means we are not broadcasting to the masses via print or other media. For example, Joe Johnson, the owner of Really Right Stuff, photographed with me for a couple of days and I took him to one of my favorite waterfalls. He published the shot in his catalog, online, and, of course, was inundated by people wanting to know where it was. His response was that he was guided and didn't have a clue but it was somewhere in Central Oregon. That's the truth. He could have done some research and figured it out but why?

Our wild natural world is rapidly disappearing and the opportunities of gaining solitude without a significant expenditure of time, money and energy are indeed rare. We can't stop the hordes but maybe we can slow them down.
