

PROGRAM NIGHT - AUGUST 21ST

"Photographing the Annular Solar Eclipse of October 14, 2023" featuring Steve Peters

I enjoy landscape, seascape, and nightscape photography in my limited spare time after work, family, life, etc. I am a senior product manager for Orion Telescopes & Binoculars, a California-based company where I have worked since 1995 (now remotely).

I have witnessed two total solar eclipses and one annular eclipse, and have photographed one of each. My presentation is titled, "Photographing the Annular Solar Eclipse of October 14, 2023". I will cover the differences between an annular and a total solar eclipse, solar filters for your eyes and camera, where to go, the timing of the eclipse, camera and lens considerations, and ideas for framing and composing an annular eclipse image or sequence.

Come for the presentation, stay for the eclipse glasses! I will have a free pair of ISO-certified eclipse viewing glasses to give to all those who attend.

The Yips in Photography

At a recent wedding I found myself sitting next to a retired volleyball coach who is now a pickleball fanatic. Our conversation evolved into a discussion about the "yips". I believe this is also called a slump. In athletics it is defined as a period of time when a known high level of skill for an activity ceases to exist. It's not really burn out as the willingness is still there and, in fact, can cause a high degree of anxiety that the skill is lost.

Is this a condition that can be found in photography? You betcha! It is, however, a bit more complicated for the photographer as the yip could be skill based, creativity based or equipment based.

The equipment yip is usually the result of overlooking some feature of your camera or, heaven forbid, an actual equipment failure. In my case, I had several occasions where my studio flashes would not fire. I would try everything and the test flash worked perfectly. I resorted to speed lights if I could not get away with available light. After much head scratching and research I found one little sentence squirreled away in an article that said the remote transmitter will not work with electronic shutter. The shutter must be in mechanical mode. Duh! That yip caused me to miss some great studio opportunities.

Skill based yips in photography are usually the result of anticipating a certain level of skill without the expected results. It might be a stretch to call it a yip but inability when you use to be able to competently capture a scene definitely produces anxiety. The remedy is often to go back to fundamentals and practice with less stressful situations. It's always a revelation when you discover something as simple shooting stance or jerky shutter release was the problem.

A creative slump is the mother of all photographic yips. Most folks identified as "creative" are aware of creative yips. Sometimes it is simply a matter of taking a break but for most creatives it usually requires breaking patterns. You need new stimulation. It could be as simple as accepting an invitation from friends to visit a place you have never been or going to a lecture or talking to other creative folks. Basically, it's a matter of opening your receptors. Dewitt Jones the National Geo photographer turned lecturer and philosopher says it's all about letting it all out and then letting it all in. Whew, deep stuff! Time for me to let it all out...
